Erik Sevigny assumed his duties as the Army ROTC Enrollment Officer at the University of New Mexico in August 2010. Before this he was a career Army officer, serving 24 years in the U.S. Army and retiring as a lieutenant colonel in 2010.

While serving in the Army, Erik held many positions of leadership and responsibility. His final assignment was as the Professor of Military Science for the University of New Mexico Army ROTC program.

Previously, he served as the Deputy Inspector General for the 25th Infantry Division and U.S. Army Hawaii. He served for a year as the executive officer of Task Force Bobcat in Afghanistan during Operation Enduring Freedom – 5 and for a year as the battalion executive officer for 2nd Battalion, 5th Infantry Regiment, 25th Infantry Division (Light) at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii. His other assignments include Inspector General for White Sands Missile Range, Senior Observer Controller/Trainer in the 4th Brigade, 91st Division at FT Lewis, WA, Company Commander of Alpha Company, 1st Battalion, 30th Infantry Regiment, 3rd Infantry Division, at FT Benning, GA, Assistant Operations Officer in both 1st Battalion, 30th Infantry Regiment, 3rd Infantry Division and 3rd Battalion, 5th Cavalry Regiment, 3rd Armor Division; Senior Platoon Trainer at the Infantry Officer Basic Course; Project Officer for the Infantry School's Task Force XXI; Headquarters Company Executive Officer, 3rd Battalion, 5th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Armor Division; and Platoon Leader, 5th Battalion, 5th Cavalry Regiment, 3rd Armor Division, both in Germany and Southwest Asia during Desert Shield and Desert Storm.

Erik is a graduate of Webster University with a Master of Arts degree in Management and the University of New Hampshire with a Bachelor of Science degree in biology. He earned his commission through the ROTC program at the University of New Hampshire and was commissioned as an Infantry lieutenant in 1988.

His military education includes the Command and General Staff College, the Inspectors' General course, Combined Arms Staff and Service School, the Infantry Officer Advanced and Basic courses.

Erik's awards include the Bronze Star Medal (2 Oak Leaf Clusters), the Meritorious Service Medal (2 Oak Leaf Clusters), the Army Commendation Medal (2 Oak Leaf Clusters), the Army Achievement Medal (2 Oak Leaf Clusters), the Valorous Unit Award, the Meritorious Unit Citation, the Combat and Expert Infantryman's Badges, the Basic Parachutist Badge, and the Ranger Tab.
